For every Horse or other beast of draught, drawing any Waggon or other such four-wheeled Carriage, having the sole or bottom of the felloes of the wheels thereof of the breadth of nine inches, with flat surfaces, the sum of

Paying with 300 lbs

For every Horse or other beast of draught, drawing any Waggon or other such four-wheeled Carriage, having the sole or bottom of the felloes of the wheels thereof of the breadth of sixteen inches, with flat surfaces, the sum of

3d.

4½d.

For every Horse or other beast of draught, drawing any Cart or other such Carriage, having the sole or bottom of the felloes of the wheels thereof of the breadth of nine inches, with flat surfaces, the sum of

4d.

6d.

For every Horse or other beast of draught, drawing any Waggon or other such four-wheeled Carriage; and for every Horse or other beast of draught drawing any Cart or other such Carriage, ^{with cylindrical wheels} having the sole or bottom of the felloes of the wheels thereof of the breadth of six inches, with flat surfaces, the sum of

4d.

6d.

For every Horse or other beast of draught, drawing any Waggon or other such four-wheeled Carriage; and for every Horse or other beast of draught, drawing any Cart or other such Carriage, having the sole or bottom of the felloes of the wheels thereof of the breadth of four inches and a half, with flat surfaces, the sum of

5d.

7½d.

For every Horse or other beast of draught, drawing any Waggon or other such four-wheeled Carriage; and for every Horse or other beast of draught, drawing any Cart or other such Carriage, having the sole or bottom of the felloes of the wheels thereof of a less breadth than four inches, with flat surfaces, the sum of

6d.

9d.

For every Horse, Mare, Gelding, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the sum of

1½d.

For every drove of Oxen or Neat Cattle the sum of 10d. per score, and so in proportion for any less number.

10d.

And for every drove of Calves, Hogs, Sheep, or Lambs, the sum of 5d. per score, and so in proportion for any less number.

5d.
